How to get to the Black Rock Trail:

Take exit 15, which is the Berwick exit. Head north on Highway 330 for about 3.5 km. Then turn north (left) onto Black Rock Road, which goes under Highway #10 (into Highway #221 for 5 km. Then turn north (left) onto Black Rock Road, which begins in Waterville at the Highway #1 junction near the post office, but the main trail head and also the parking lot are located at Number 440 Black Rock Road behind the Community Hall.
